QMC&S HISTORY



QMC&S HQ Fort Lee, VA



U.S. Army Quartermaster School dedicated its new Headquarters Building, Mifflin Hall, on 19 May 1961. The following year the Office of The Quartermaster General in Washington DC was abolished and the QM School at Fort Lee was formally designated *"Home of the Quartermaster Corps."*

Supply and Service Proponency. TRADOC and U.S. Army Logistics Center was created in July 1973, and the QMC&S became the Army's main focal point, or *proponent*, for Supply and Service training, doctrine and combat developments.

Fort Lee Realignment. QMC&S relinquished command of Fort Lee Garrison to the Logistics Center, which was reorganized and redesignated US Army Combined Arms Support Command (CASCOM).

Consolidation of MOSs. The 92A Automated Logistical Specialist was created by consolidating four separate QM supply and service MOSs (76C, 76P, 76V and 76X).

BRAC 2005 designated Fort Lee as Sustainment Center of Excellence (SCoE) with plans to consolidate QM, ORD, TC training, doctrine, combat developments.

QMC&S HQ Projected Move into new SCoE Headquarters, marking latest phase of consolidated training and combat developments for the Army Logistics Corps here at Fort Lee.







- Conduct CSA SEA Program, co-or CLEA initiatives and maintain DA PAMs 710-2-1/2



Mortuary Affairs Center



- Serves as the Joint Training and Doctrine Integrating Center who:
 - Develops Joint Mortuary Affairs doctrine
 - Conducts Joint Mortuary Affairs training
- Provides assistance and interpretation of joint doctrine for implementation in Joint Theaters of Operation
- Serves as an advisor to the Department of the Army G4 on:
 - Capabilities and readiness of the Mortuary Affairs Force
 - Adequacy of equipment
 - Training of the Force
- Provides advice and assistance as needed during:
 - Contingency operations
 - Mass fatality events


