


Aerial Delivery/Field Service

 - Airdrop and sling load inspectors
 - Shower, laundry and clothing repair specialists
- Develop doctrine, airdrop rigging and sling load manuals, and resident/non-resident training support materials
- Perform proponency functions related to aerial delivery and field services

Joint Culinary Center of Excellence



- **Train Soldiers, Civilians and members of other services/countries in all aspects of Army subsistence for both garrison and field feeding missions**

- **Develop Army subsistence concepts, doctrine, systems and materiel requirements to meet worldwide commitments**

Joint Mortuary Affairs Center



- Train Army Officers, Enlisted, Civilians and Marines as specialists in Mortuary Affairs
- Serves as the Joint Training and Doctrine Integrating Center to:
 - Develop doctrine and conduct Joint Mortuary Affairs
- Provide assistance and interpretation of joint doctrine for implementation in Joint Theaters of Operation
- Serves as the Executive Agent for the Department of the Army G-4 on all mortuary affairs matters.
- Provide advice and assistance as needed during:
 - Contingency operations
 - Mass fatality events

Logistics Training Department



- Provide basic unit supply (92Y10) and automation supply (92A10) training to Advance Individual Training (AIT) QM enlisted Soldiers
- Provide Mobile Training Team (MTT) and resident training classes in support of our Operational Forces:
 - Unit Armorer Certification Course (MTT)
 - 2-week course
 - 12 classes per year starting FY10
 - Unit Level Logistics System-Aviation Enhanced (ULLS-A/E) Resident Course
 - 2-week course
 - 18 classes per year starting FY10
 - An Additional Skill Identifier (ASI) course . Graduates receive an ASI C7


