

Review of AR 30-22 Change



This revision dated 10 May 2005---

- * Transfers disposition guidance for all Army Food Program documents from Army Regulation 25-400-2 to DA Pamphlet 30-22 (chap 1).
- * Updates Army Staff; major Army command (see glossary); Army Center of Excellence, Subsistence; installation command; State Directorate of Logistics/United States Property & Fiscal Officer; and unit command responsibilities (chap 2).
- * Prescribes responsibilities for the newly created Installation Management Agency and its subordinate regions (chap 2).



Review of AR 30-22 Change



- * Changes the Food Service Management Plan submission requirements from every 2 years to annually (para 3-10).
- * Increases the dollar value of loss that requires report of survey action from \$350 to \$500 (para 3-16).
- * Directs the food program manager to implement the decisions made by the Food Service Management Board (para 3-18).
- * Requires installation commander approval to deviate from a 90-minute meal-serving period in any way (para 3-20).
- * Requires identification of requisitioning and receiving personnel in the dining facility (para 3-21).



Review of AR 30-22 Change



- * Prohibits food service personnel from being the assigned headcounter unless specifically authorized by the installation commander (para 3-26).
- * Requires Deputy Chief of Staff, G-4 approval prior to an installation returning to a fixed-price meal system after implanting à la carte (para 3-29).
- * Restates the policy for the holiday meal basic daily food allowance to clarify guidance (para 3-29).
- * Updates guidance for and directs the use of the Reserve Component Subsistence System for all Army National Guard and Army Reserve inactive duty for training and annual training feeding not conducted on an Active Army installation (para 3-30).



Review of AR 30-22 Change



- * Requires that the recommended contracting officer's representative meet the requirements found in DA Pamphlet 30-22 (para 3-39).
- * Re-delegates the approval authority for catered meals in support of Active Army units from the major Army commands to the Deputy Chief of Staff, G-4 (para 3-41).
- * Updates administrative requirements and responsibilities for the Department of Army Philip A. Connelly Awards Program for Excellence in Army Food Service, referred to hereafter as "Philip A. Connelly Program" (para 3-46).



Review of AR 30-22 Change



- * Adds guidance for installation tenant units competing in the Philip A. Connelly Program and authorizes full time Reserve Component dining facilities operating under Army Ration Credit System as competitors in the program (para 3-46).
- * Updates member requirements of the Food Service Management Board (para 3-54).
- * Eliminates the use of the DD Form 1608 for unsatisfactory material reporting (chap 3).
- * Expands the guidance for contingency operations (chap 4).
- * Identifies the conditions when bottled water may be purchased using subsistence funds (para 4-14).



Status of DA Pam 30-22



- Delayed at LTA
- Currently at USAPD
- Submitted for editing, artwork redesign, and authentication
- Estimate posting to USAPD website March 06
- Effective date April 06
- Procedural changes will mirror policy changes in AR 30-22

 - Limited assets
 - Transportation
 - Storage



- Day 31-60
 - Sufficient assets for perishable components
 - Refrigeration
 - Storage
 - Transportation



- Day 61-90
 - Increased assets

BOTTLED WATER



- Not with MPA funds except under the following conditions
 - Deploying units may purchase 3 days of bottled water as part of UBL
 - Purchases (amount and cost) must be tracked using appropriate contingency operations code on OPORD
 - Not authorized for preparation for deployment
 - Not authorized for use in LTAs
 - Must be from an approved source
 - Unflavored and with screw on/off caps only



Publication Revision Process



- Electronic publication by Army Publishing Directorate (formerly USAPA)
 - www.apd.army.mil
- Access forms on the same site- not local Formflow server
- “Clean text” changes
- Edition date and Summary of Changes
- “Figure” links to example and instructions
- “Form” links to blank Formflow form



Proposed future changes to 30-22



- Incorporate revised AR 735-5 guidance
 - ROS becomes Financial Liability Investigation
 - DA Form 4697 becomes DD Form 200, Financial Liability Investigation of Property Loss
 - Thresholds remain same (\$500 and \$4000)



Proposed future changes to 30-22



- Replace DFAC Advisory council with BOSS, paragraphs 3-19 and 3-54
- Incorporation of MTSS guidance
- Reimbursement between Active Army and RC of other services- to become common service



Proposed future changes to 30-22



- Rescission of DA Form 7169, Troop Issue Subsistence Management Report
- Reference to AR 500-60 deleted, reference to DOD Directives 3025.1 and 3025.15
- HCP guidance
 - Not authorized in UBL
 - Not for CONUS or short term training
 - Not for developed theater (AAFES Support)



Proposed future changes to 30-22



- Incorporate Javits-Wagner-O'Day Program Guidance
 - Public Law (JWOD Act- 1938, rev 1971)
 - Implementation guidance in Code of Federal Regulations (41 CFR ch 51) and Federal Acquisition Regulations (FAR subpart 8.7)
 - Presidential appointed Committee for Purchase from People Who Are Blind or Severely Disabled administers program
 - National Industries for Blind and National Industries for the Severely Handicapped are designated by the Committee to distribute orders among non-profit JWOD Program agencies



Proposed future changes to 30-22



- Incorporate Javits-Wagner-O'Day Program Guidance (Cont'd)
 - Committee establishes Federal Procurement List of over 7700 items split between NISH and NIB
 - 35 food items, some only USDA, some only in OPRATS
 - 15 affecting garrison operations
 - List is updated periodically, www.jwod.gov
 - Closing the loop

Proposed future changes to 30-22



- Updated CONOPS guidance
 - Current policy in para 3-44j states that appropriated fund food service assets cannot be used for social functions
 - AOR request
 - Update CONOPS guidance to authorize the following special events
 - VIP or distinguished visitor visits
 - Semi-annual unit moral sustaining events
 - Monthly promotion and birthday events
 - Transfer of authority events



Proposed future changes to 30-22



- Updated CONOPS guidance (Cont'd)
 - “Free feeding” not authorized per OTJAG
 - Development of Garrison style headcount procedures for LOGCAP feeding
 - Use PDS for first 21 days under LOGCAP until historical headcount established
 - No cash collection
 - 3032s for each category of “other”
 - Report and reimbursement at Army level
