Potential savings by implementing account management and policies

- Reduction in food costs: 40% of \$1.28B (Projected PWC delivered cost for next 12 mo)
Average daily delivered cost = \$3.5M
 - Will also:
 - Cut labor for KBR
 - Reduce KBR storage
 - Reduce PWC labor
 - Reduce number of trucks in convoy
 - Reduce needed security platforms which returns Soldiers to other duties and saves lives
- BDFA (\$17.70) started 1 Aug 05
 - For budgeting and official purposes effective 1 Oct 05



Concluding Objective

Reducing costs and waste associated with LOGCAP and Class I Food Service Operations in the AOR

Implement and enforce portion control

Implement procedures to eliminate carry-out abuse

Eliminate high dollar item self-service bars

Adhere to the DA 21-day CONOPS Menu/employ order helper

Initiate account management procedures

Implement demonstrated headcount procedures

Employ and appoint 92G/922A's as COTRs- continuous training is a must




