1. The general, comprehensive personal statement:

This allows you maximum freedom in terms of what you write and is the type of statement that often explains what's special, unique, distinctive, and/or impressive about you or your life story and military career.

2. The response to very specific questions:

What details of your life (personal or professional, history, people or events that have shaped you or influenced your goals) might help the committee better understand you or help set you apart from other applicants?

What are your career goals? What personal characteristics (integrity, compassion, and/or persistence) do you possess that would improve your prospects for success in the field or profession? Is there a way to demonstrate or document that you have these character traits required to serve as an Enlisted Aide?
