

- Revised AR 30-22 authenticated by OAASA on 31 March 2005 (Major revision)

- Effective date 10 May 2005

- Most important changes:

- Inclusion of IMA

- Redistribution of responsibilities

- Revised DA Pam 30-22 authenticated by APD on 30 November 2006 (Major revision)

- Effective date ~~3 January 2007~~

Publication Revision Process



- Electronic publication by Army Publishing Directorate (formerly USAPA)
- Publication process:
 - Rapid action revisions (8 pages or less)
 - Prioritize changes
 - Publish every 6-9 months
 - www.apd.army.mil
- “Clean text” changes/Edition date and Summary of Changes
- Next revision under development, look for it early next CY.



Proposed future changes to 30-22



- Incorporate revised AR 735-5 guidance
 - ROS becomes Financial Liability Investigation
 - DA Form 4697 becomes DD Form 200, Financial Liability Investigation of Property Loss
 - Thresholds remain same (\$500 and \$4000)



Proposed future changes to 30-22



- Incorporation of MTSS guidance
- Rescission of DA Form 7169, Troop Issue Subsistence Management Report
- TISA to become Subsistence Supply Management Office
- Increase cash allowed on hand in DFAC to \$1500



Proposed future changes to 30-22



- Updated CONOPS guidance
 - Current policy in para 3-44j states that appropriated fund food service assets cannot be used for social functions
 - AOR request
 - Update CONOPS guidance to authorize the following special events
 - VIP or distinguished visitor visits
 - Semi-annual unit moral sustaining events
 - Monthly promotion and birthday events
 - Transfer of authority events



Grey areas



- Reimbursement between Active Army and RC of other services- to become common service?
- Flight meals and box lunches



Grey areas



- Support of ARNG and USAR annual training
 - At installation
 - Off installation
- Application of terms installation commander, garrison commander, senior mission commander



Role of Tactical Food Advisor in Garrison



- Advise commander having operational control of dining facility operations on food service matters (AR 30-22, para 3-12 b & c)
- Quarterly action plans (AR 30-22 para 3-13/DA Pam 30-22 para 3-8)
 - Administration
 - Subsistence
 - Sanitation
 - Food Safety (DA 5161)
 - Personnel
 - Equipment
 - Facilities
 - Resource management



Role of Tactical Food Advisor in Garrison



- Operational Reviews (DA Pam 30-22 Appendix C)
 - High Dollar Subsistence (monthly)
 - Requisitioning and Receiving (semi-annually)
 - Physical Security (semi-annually)
- Inventory Management (DA Pam 30-22 para 3-20)
 - Compare actual inventory levels to authorized amounts (AR 30-22 para 3-24)
 - Assist FOS in developing corrective action



Role of Tactical Food Advisor in Garrison



- Account status review (DA Pam 30-22 para 3-46)
 - Monthly review of account status (+3/-10%)
 - Assist the FOS in developing remedial action plan
- Approve local box lunch menus (in-house ingredients) (DA Pam 30-22 para 3-56)



Role of Tactical Food Advisor in Garrison



- Food service equipment actions (DA Pam 30-22 para 3-63)
 - Notify FPM on equipment replacement requirements
 - Ensure requisition paperwork is completed and submitted
 - Ensure follow on training is conducted and documented
- Ensure Army mend standards are addressed for all meals planned in MTOE dining facilities operating under ARCS (DA Pam 30-22, para 3-70b)
- Review of Ration Control Sheets (AR 30-22 para 3-37b)
- Oversee 92G MOS OJT (FM 10-23-2)



FM 10-23-2 and FM 10-23-1

ISSUE

- **FM 10-23-2 provides tactics, techniques, and procedures for garrison food operations.**
- **FM 10-23-2 is currently under revision and will be published as FM 4-20.52 when complete.**
- **FM 10-23-1 is a guide to food program operations for commanders.**
- **FM 10-23-1 is planned for revision upon completion of FM 4-20.52 and will be published as FM 4-20.51 when complete.**

FACTS

- **Work on FM 10-23-2 revision is on-hold pending completion of update to AR/DA Pam 30-22.**
- **Work on FM 10-23-2 will resume when 30-22 update is submitted for publication.**
- **Work will begin on FM 10-23-1 upon completion of higher priority publications.**

WAY AHEAD

- **Plan is to resume work on FM 10-23-2 in late 4th Q FY 07 with estimated completion date of 2nd Q FY 08.**

Draft FM 4.20.2(FM 10-23) Doctrine



ISSUE

- ACES Revision of 10 year old Army Doctrinal Field Manual. FM 10-23, Doctrine for Army Field Feeding and Class I Management Operations.

FACTS

- ACES completed major revision of legacy FM 10-23.
- Updated to include Army transformation doctrine and operational concepts, LOGCAP, Class I and field food service operations and equipment.
- Draft FM forwarded to CASCOM Concepts and Doctrine Directorate on 10 May for their requirement for worldwide staffing. (45 Days)
- ACES will incorporate appropriate recommended changes as a result of CASCOM worldwide staffing- Few expected.
- Publisher
- Expect FM release of FM 4.20.2 to field in the October / November timeframe.

WAY AHEAD

- Finalize Draft, Brief leadership, CG CASCOM authorizes release.



COMMON FOOD MANAGEMENT SYSTEM CFMS



ISSUE

- The Department of Defense Joint Subsistence Policy Board directed DLA to establish a common food management system to replace the five existing Services food management systems. COTS commercial Horizons One Source Program software program chosen by Joint Subsistence Board vice available Services GOTS Programs as the way ahead. Contract awarded to IBM/Horizons One Source.
- DSCP has PM oversight of the CFMS project. Objective is to develop and deploy a single Service system that will increase functionality and capability, meet the present and future food operations and management needs of the all services, both garrison and tactical.

FACTS

- COTS Program in development since 2003. Design is Web based.
- Critical Design Review completed by all Services in April 2007.
- COTS program gaps identified by Services still being resolved by IBM/Horizons.
- CFMS must perform and provide the same or better reporting capabilities as current Army AFMIS web based system or Army will not support deployment.

WAY AHEAD

- Pilot Program Scheduled for test at Ft. Eustis, June 2008.
- Informational (No action required)
